

How To Apply

Welcome prospective exchange students! We are excited that you are visiting our website with hopes of attending Loyola University Maryland. Loyola only accepts exchange students from its [exchange partner institutions](#). If you are a student at one of these universities, please contact your International Office to find out if you are eligible to apply to Loyola's exchange program. Once you have received approval through your home institution, you can then begin the application process with Loyola. The exchange coordinator at your home university will work with you to complete this process.

All exchange student applicants may access the below link to create their Exchange Student Application login.

Application Requirements - Prospective Applicants should review application requirements and instructions to be completed before they can be considered for admission to Loyola University Maryland.

Admission requirements must be submitted by the deadline as the electronic portal will automatically close at this time.

Admission to Loyola University Maryland is not confirmed until a prospective applicant receives admission information/ a decision from the Office of International Student Services (OISS) indicating their admission to Loyola is confirmed.

Students interested in studying abroad at Loyola University Maryland should have a suggested GPA of 3.0 or higher; students with GPAs lower than 3.0 are encouraged to provide insight to their academic goals in their Application for Exchange Student in the Application Portal.

Please note, financial documentation must be current and dated within the last 3 months.


Application Process

In order to apply, you will need to create a login username and password for our electronic application portal. Please follow the instructions (steps 1-6) below so that you can create a username and password in order to proceed with your application.

Step 1. To begin the process, click on this link:



Step 2. Click “Apply Now.” You will be asked to verify if you are sure you want to create an application. Click “OK”



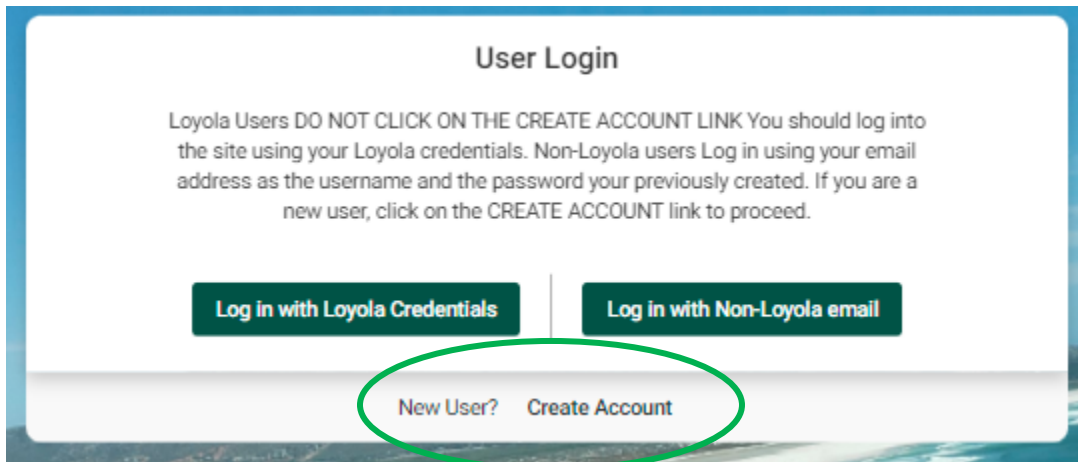

Step 3. You will see a page with login instructions. Choose the option “**New User? Create Account**”



Step 4: You will be led to a page where you will need to put in an active email address so that you can create an application and password. Fill in the fields appropriate on the “User Registration” page. Exchange student applicants are required to use their **home university** email address when creating their login credentials for the portal (in other words, personal email addresses such as gmail, hotmail, etc. are not accepted). Click “Register” when done.



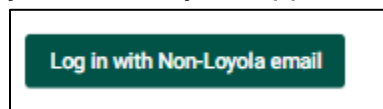
Step 5: Choose your intended program and click "Continue"




Step 6. You will then be brought to your application page and will need to fill in your Gender and Date of Birth. Read the information in the box. If you agree, click "Update." You will then have access to your Exchange Student Application.

Returning to Your Application

You can always save and return to your application. To do so, go back to the link provided, and login using your username and permanent password by clicking on "Log in with NON-Loyola Email." Or, revisit the site by going to this link: <https://studyabroad.loyola.edu/index.cfm?FuseAction=Security.AngLogin> and choosing the "Log in with NON-Loyola Email" option. You will need to use the email that you created your application page with as well as the password you created.




You will then see this screen:
